Currently in the midst of his 19th season as the head coach of the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program, Phil Martelli has become just as synonymous with Saint Joseph's, or perhaps even moreso, than the beloved Hawk mascot, the magis and a Larry's cheesesteak.

Martelli was named head coach in 1995 after serving as an assistant coach for 10 seasons. Rooted in a city overflowing with a rich basketball tradition, Saint Joseph's has enjoyed a storied history of exciting players, a raucous fan base and a collection of legendary head coaches that could rival any collegiate basketball program.

And atop that enormous heap of SJU basketball nostalgia, Coach Martelli sits just a smidge higher than everyone else.

Martelli's resume is undeniable. He holds every major coaching record at Saint Joseph's. He is the Hawks' all-time leader in wins, having

surpassed Bill Ferguson's record of 309 during the 2011-12 season. He holds the school record for most wins in a season (30), which he set during the historic 2003-04 season when he was also named *Associated Press* Coach of the Year. He's been named Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year four times (1997, 2001, 2004, 2005).

No coach in Saint Joseph's men's basketball team history can boast these accomplishments; not McKinney, Lynam, or even Ramsay.

In addition, Martelli has guided Saint Joseph's to 20 or more victories seven times, which is the most for any coach in school history, and his 167 wins in Atlantic 10 play are the most conference wins for any active coach.

But it's not just the athletic community to whom Martelli has endeared himself. His charitable efforts are bountiful, his heart always looking to help wherever he can.

He is currently the chairman of the “Coaches vs. Cancer” National Council as well as the co-chair of the Philadelphia chapter of the organization; a collaboration between all of the city’s Division I coaches, it has become one of the top fundraising groups in the country.

So much has changed in the SJU basketball landscape since Martelli set foot on Hawk Hill for the first time as an assistant coach in 1985. The Hawks upgraded the old Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse to the comparatively palatial Hagan Arena in 2009. The Atlantic 10 has undergone realignment, adding and subtracting various members. Rules were put in place to prevent players from jumping straight to the NBA from high school.

He’s adapted over that time and adjusted different subtle nuances in his coaching style when necessary. For example, his practices run shorter now because it works best for his current group.

“I think that I’ve always been a stickler for time,” he said. “I appreciate the fact that the players have responsibilities to be not just academic students, but college guys, the opportunity to make friends for life.

“I would also say that I’m more knowledgeable now than I was 19 years ago in terms of searching and probing for X’s and O’s.”

Surrounded by stiffer competition, Martelli says recruiting is far more difficult than it was 19 years ago, but it doesn’t change the type of student-athlete he looks for.

“I’ve driven myself to search for two things: young guys that want to be at Saint Joseph’s,

and who love the game of basketball,” he explained. “It’s such a terrific game and can change lives.

“People ask me, ‘how many days a year do you recruit?’ I say, ‘365 days a year.’ I’m really driven to find young guys that fit [the program] and love the basketball opportunity they’re presented.”

He’s even cut down on his trademark wit and humor at times. In a world filled with 24-hour sports news coverage and instant updates at a suffocating rate on social media sites like Twitter, he’s very much aware of the ever-changing climate of sports and information.

“I used humor a lot in my early years,” he said. “I think you have to be careful now how things are heard and how they’re perceived. I’m not saying it’s better or worse, I’m just saying that’s who I am now.”

Martelli’s self-evaluation of his career on Hawk Hill runs so much deeper than wins and losses.

“What have I done today to be better as a person? What have I done to be better as a coach?” he said. “I’ve tried to go day by day. In my opening press conference I said my intention was to make my family and everyone associated with Saint Joseph’s proud of the decision to make me head coach. That’s the same today.”

When asked if he ever thought it would turn out like this, he didn’t hesitate.

“No,” he chuckled. “It’s truly an honor and a blessing I’ve been given to coach Saint Joseph’s.”

There have been many good teams and electric players that have galvanized Hawk Hill during Martelli's tenure as head coach. When asked what season was his best coaching performance, he paused for a few seconds and gave an answer most probably would not have expected.

"2004-05 [the year after reaching the Elite Eight]," he answered emphatically. "We were down and out. We had to change our style and we ended up playing for the Atlantic 10 championship and in the NIT championship game. We played Xavier in the Atlantic 10 Championship in Cincinnati and we lost in the last minute."

Coaches and players from all sports always say they remember the heartbreakng losses much more than the victories. You could sense his connection to that team and their journey that season.

"That's the game that has stayed with me the longest," he said, thinking back on how close that team came. "Those players deserved to go out as champions. They gave everything they had physically and emotionally. They were a championship team, it just didn't show up on the scoreboard."

When Martelli first became head coach back in 1995, he focused on two primary goals: improving every day both as a coach and as a person, and always representing Saint Joseph's to the best of his capabilities. When Saint Joseph's encourages the community to strive for the *magis*, a Latin word for "greater," they are referring to a philosophy of doing more for your faith and for others.

So when the conversation with Coach Martelli focused on describing his current team, it wasn't surprising that the first word he used was "character." He talked about how proud he was of them for their efforts in the various team-organized charity events during the holiday season.

"It's a wonderful group of [high]-character guys," he said.

This season is still a work in progress for the Hawks.

"We're at a C-minus right now," Martelli said honestly when asked to assess his team's performance. "But there are a lot of opportunities ahead of us.

"As long as this team stays to the tenets that I believe in, which is daily improvement and constant communication, then the goal here, and it's an attainable goal, is that in March we're playing our best basketball and we'll see where it lies."

TV/RADIO COVERAGE

The Saint Joseph's Sports Network (SJSN) marks its 24th year of operation in 2013-14. Since its beginnings in 1990, SJSN's coverage of Hawk athletics has grown and included Phil Martelli's *HawkTalk* radio program and the nationally-renowned *HawkTalk* television show, which ran for 15 years.

For the third consecutive year, every Saint Joseph's game will be broadcast on one of the top sports radio stations in the nation, CBS Sports Radio 610 (WIP-AM). This marks the most comprehensive radio package for Hawk basketball since the 2005-06 season. The station will also be the home for Phil Martelli's *HawkTalk* radio show, which will air on Monday evenings from January to March.
